

- Legal aid cell – provides free legal assistance (counseling, mediation and case filing)
- Fact finding cell – investigate serious cases of violence and injustice.
- Advocacy cell – conducting professional and action research. Effective campaigning. Publishing IEC (information, education, communication materials) and promoting mass awareness.
- Training cell – professional and popular training on legal rights, Human rights and the prosecution system.
- The shelter home – a temporary safe home for survivors of all forms of violence including trafficking. It is run using a rights based approach.
- Anti-trafficking cell – leading on repatriating, Rehabilitating and re-integrating women and children victims of trafficking.
- IRD (Institute of Rights & Development)- a sister concern of BNWLA, engaged in delivering professional trainings in the field of human rights.
- Information Resource centre – on information centre on reported incidents of violence against women, and a key collection of publications on the history and interests of BNWLA.

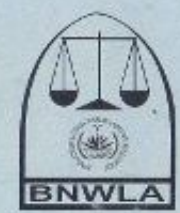
